What is “Healthcare Week?”

Healthcare Week is an exciting and unique experience for high school students. Mentored by a volunteer from the healthcare community, students spend an intensive week in a simulated “clinic” environment learning teambuilding, leadership and life skills. It’s a crash course in the challenges and opportunities of life after high school such as preparing for a career, workplace issues, managing money, networking skills and so much more!

Students are part of a small team (“clinic”) of students from around the state. As a mentor “Clinic Advisor,” you will help your “clinic” complete challenges with real-life scenarios, including working through a nationwide health crisis, hands-on clinical workshops, life science challenges and personal health seminars. You’ll have the opportunity to network with other healthcare professionals and enhance or develop your skills in leadership, small group management and general business management.

Judges are also needed!

At the end-of-the-week, the clinics compete in a Trade Show and make a presentation to their “Board of Directors.” Volunteers from the healthcare community judge the presentations and “invest” venture capital in the clinics of their choice. Judging requires a half-day time commitment on a Friday morning.
