What is “Business Week?”

Washington Business Week is an exciting and unique experience for high school students. Mentored by a volunteer from the business community, students spend an intensive week in a simulated “corporate” environment learning business, teambuilding, leadership and life skills. It’s a crash course in the challenges and opportunities of life after high school such as preparing for a career, workplace issues, managing money, networking skills, email etiquette, business ethics and so much more!

Students are part of a small team (“company”) of students from around the state. As a mentor “Company Advisor,” you will help your “company” complete challenges with real-life business scenarios through a computer simulation, competing against one another in the world of production, marketing and finance. Throughout the week you’ll have the opportunity to network and enhance or develop your skills in leadership, small group management, finance and general business management.

Judges are also needed!

At the end-of-the-week, the companies compete in a Trade Show and make a Stockholder’s presentation. Volunteers from the business community judge the presentations and “invest” venture capital in the companies of their choice. Judging requires a half-day time commitment.
