Business Week

Business Week prepares high school students to enter the workforce by giving them the skills, confidence and values to succeed in life. Often, a summer program like this is the first “taste” of college life for the students who live on campus the full week. Students form a “Company” of 10 students mentored by a volunteer “Company Advisor” from the business community. The “Companies” create management teams, develop mission statements, determine business strategies, and make financial and ethical decisions. This takes place while competing in BIZSim, a computer software program that simulates two years of financial inputs/outcomes for their “Company”.

Students also attend business seminars, engage in team building activities, prepare Stockholder Presentations and produce a Trade Show. “Investor Education Day” focuses on how students can build their credit, prevent identity theft and protect their financial futures.
