



2012 Alaska Business Week Summer Programs **STUDENT INSTRUCTIONS**

READ CAREFULLY!

PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Students arriving on Saturday, July 14 will be checked into the dorms upon arrival. **Registration will be held on Sunday, July 15, from 10:30 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.** At registration you will be assigned to a "company" and receive your official Business Week T-shirt and notebook. Students arriving with friends may dorm together, but both students must check-in at the same time as the universities will not allow us to reserve or block rooms. **Please allow at least twenty minutes to register!** You do not need to arrive early. Parents and friends (who are not attending the program) may wait for you nearby and review your student notebook and schedule.

LUNCH is available before 12:45 p.m. on Sunday as a part of the program for those who have registered on time. Parents and guests are welcome to join you; their meal is at their own expense (generally under \$10). Your registration fee covers the cost of all your meals.

THE PROGRAM BEGINS promptly at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. Family and friends are welcome to attend the opening assembly. It is extremely important that you **be there on time!**

LATE ARRIVAL - If for any reason you cannot arrive on time, please let us know ahead of time. Until July 13th email registrar@wbw.org or call 800-686-6442. After July 13th call 907-474-5922.

PROGRAM DURATION - The program will commence on Sunday, July 15 at 1:00 p.m. and conclude on the morning of Saturday, July 21. You may depart after you wake up - breakfast will be served until 8:30 a.m. and you should check out of the dorm by 10 a.m. There is no programming on Saturday. With parent/guardian permission, students are able to leave Friday evening after the awards and recognition ceremony which concludes at about 9 p.m.

FRIDAY NIGHT AWARDS CEREMONY - Dress Up Event - Parents are invited to attend a special reception on Friday, July 20. The Business Week Awards and Recognition Ceremony will start at 7:00p.m. Parents, friends and family are encouraged to attend if possible. More details will follow. Students are asked to dress up. Students will be seated with their Business Week Company during the ceremony.

TELEPHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES - Cell phones, text messaging, MP3 players, and any other electronic devices are allowed, but **must** be turned **OFF** during all program sessions, speakers, company meetings, etc. This includes games too! It's also easier to meet new friends when your ears aren't plugged into an iPod. Alaska Business Week will not be responsible for lost, stolen or damaged personal items.

CLOTHING AND THE WEATHER - Business Week sessions are informal. Most likely the days will be warm and the evenings will be cooler. Shorts, t-shirts, and a sweatshirt are advised. The Friday morning presentations and evening awards ceremony are dress-up time —dresses, sweaters, slacks, sport jackets and ties are appropriate if you have them. Shoes and shirts are an absolute **must** in the dining halls and the gym. Dress that constitutes a safety hazard or that disrupts the environment is prohibited. **Clothing or jewelry that displays illegal/immoral actions or items including, but not limited to, alcohol, drugs, gangs, or violence are *not* to be worn on campus.**

TALENT SHOW - There will be a student talent show on Thursday evening. All participants are expected to attend. Of course, performing in the talent show is optional. Please think about your special talents and come prepared to share. This is guaranteed to be a special evening.

TRANSPORTATION TO THE PROGRAM - Transportation to and from Fairbanks is not provided. However, due to generous support from the Alaska Railroad Corporation, we are able to offer complimentary round-trip train tickets from Anchorage to Fairbanks. We have also received a generous contribution from Era Alaska and will be able to provide a limited number of round trip airfare tickets to students outside of the Anchorage area on a first-come, first-served basis. More information is available on the Transportation Form online. We suggest that local students carpool/travel with other students from your school/area. Business Week will offer shuttle service from the airport or train depot to the campus.

AUTOMOBILES - If you bring your car to Business Week, you will be asked to park in a special parking lot. A parking pass costing \$15 will be required. You will be required to check your keys with the housing staff. Do not plan to use your car during the week. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

MISCELLANEOUS

Daily recreation is available. Please bring tennis shoes and gym clothes. Softball and volleyball equipment **may** be provided. Activities **may** include volleyball, basketball and a climbing wall.

We do not expect you to have any visitors during the week. **Please do not invite friends to see you; this is an intensive six-day program for participants only.**

Most areas of the campus will be open for your exploration and use during your free time each afternoon. A campus map will be provided at registration. You are requested to respect the property and rights of others. On-campus retail food outlets and the bookstore will be open during the day. You will get three meals each day, so don't overload on snacks.

PLEASE BRING JUST A SMALL AMOUNT OF SPENDING MONEY (small denominations and change) FOR SNACKS AND SOUVENIRS. The cost of your room, meals, a program t-shirt and all program materials are included in your registration fee, but you will need cash for vending machines and anything you wish to purchase. The campus bookstore will be open during the week. Once again, bring **small denominations!**

A dance is planned on Wednesday evening. Only **appropriate** dancing is allowed; those violating this policy will be removed from the dance and their parents will be called. **The dance is for Business Week participants only!**

SMOKING/TOBACCO - It is against state law for a person under the age of eighteen to purchase or attempt to purchase, possess, or obtain or attempt to obtain cigarettes or tobacco products. Therefore, it is the policy of Business Week not to allow smoking during the program session for those under 18 years of age. The university also has a strict, campus-wide, no smoking policy for minors and absolutely NO smoking indoors by anyone. Violation of any laws or program guidelines/Code of Conduct while attending the Business Week Program will subject the participant to removal from the program and result in the participant being sent home.

WHILE ON CAMPUS AND CHECK OUT

We encourage you **NOT TO BRING VALUABLE ITEMS** to campus! **ALASKA BUSINESS WEEK IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST OR STOLEN ARTICLES.** MP3 players are easily stolen, so we suggest leaving them at home.

You are required to stay on campus from the time you arrive on Saturday or Sunday until you check-out on Friday night after the awards ceremony (**with parent/guardian permission**) or Saturday morning. We can arrange for doctor visits, etc.

WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO SEND ANYONE HOME WHO VIOLATES THE RULES, CODE OF CONDUCT OR IS OTHERWISE A DISTURBANCE TO THE PROGRAM AT YOUR OWN EXPENSE. SERIOUS MISCONDUCT WILL BE REPORTED TO YOUR SCHOOL PRINCIPAL AND/OR OTHER AUTHORITIES. ABSOLUTELY NO ALCOHOL, DRUGS OR WEAPONS ARE ALLOWED ON CAMPUS!
