What is Business Week?

Business Week is a unique and challenging program designed for high school students, 9th - 12th grade. Students from across the state spend an intensive week in a simulated “corporate” environment where they learn about business, teambuilding, leadership, and preparing for the workforce. Over 50,000 students have gone through WBW and many are now industry professionals.

Pathway Programs!

Our Pathway Programs target the specific industry fields of **Healthcare, Construction and Manufacturing**. Each pathway has been developed to address specific workforce needs in our state.

What will Judges do?

As a judge, you will be participating in two events. At the end of the week, student companies make a presentation to their “Stockholder’s” and compete in a Trade Show. You will judge the presentations and “invest” venture capital at the Trade Show to support a variety of new and exciting business ventures. Judging requires a half-day time commitment:

How do I become a judge?

Complete a judge’s application and mail or fax it to Washington Business Week.

What will be required of judges?

- A three and a half hour time commitment.
- 100% willingness to participate and assist students in developing a better understanding of your industry.
- Compliance with rules and policies.

Application Process

After receiving your application, we will send you additional information such as where to meet, directions and where to park.

A week prior to your participation, you will receive more program information such as where to park and where orientation will be held on campus.

Other Facts for Judges:

- Judges must be present at 8:30 a.m. for Business Week Orientation.
- Business attire is appropriate for the judging events.
- A coffee service will be available for judges between events.
